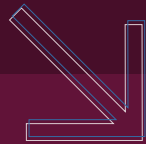

The Certificate in Maritime and Logistics

Management introduces students to the world of international business and the commercial and operational sides of the maritime transport industry. Students gain the necessary skills and knowledge to perform administrative duties in organisations involved in the maritime transport industry, and many other associated industries involved in international business.

This Certificate in Maritime and Logistics Management can also be the first step on your pathway to a management career by following our integrated education program.

Career Opportunities

The Certificate in Maritime and Logistics Management is designed to prepare students for administrative and related careers in private enterprise, industry organisations and government in the areas of:

- > Commercial Shipping
- > Ports and Terminals Administration
- > Logistics
- > Transport Policy and Administration
- > Freight Forwarding
- > Exporting and Importing

Entry Requirements

Satisfactory completion of Year 12 or equivalent. Those who have completed year 10 and have at least two years work experience may also apply.

AMC will consider applications from people who do not have the above qualification for entry but who seek admission on the basis of experience gained in industry or government. Students with English as a second language will need to have an IELTS score of 6.

There are two intakes in February and July. Some units may be available in Summer semester, commencing in November.

Mode and Duration

The Certificate in Maritime and Logistics Management consists of 4 units that are to be completed over 1 year by part-time distance education study or 1 semester full-time study on campus. Distance education provides a flexible learning approach that enables students to balance their work, study and family commitments.

Comprehensive study packages are provided to distance education students for each unit and regular communication with the lecturer is encouraged. For both distance education and on-campus students, each unit is evaluated through a range of assignments.

Our highly qualified teaching and support staff ensure that the Department of Maritime and Logistics Management sets the benchmark for a quality learning experience.

Course Structure

The Certificate in Maritime and Logistics Management consists of four units from the following, depending on study mode:

- > **International Business**
- > **Business Communication**
- > **Principles of Accounting & Finance**
- > **International Transport Systems**
- > **Cargo Handling Systems Management**
- > **Commercial Shipping**
- > **Statistics**
- > **Principles of Management**

Candidates may be granted an exemption from a unit by virtue of studies completed at a recognised tertiary institution or by holding an appropriate Vocational Training and Education (VTE) qualification.
